CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The 2009 season was another exciting and busy year for Football West but it was also a year of careful consolidation given the dramatic events which unfolded on the world's financial markets and economies.

Football West faced a number of challenges in 2009. The financial crisis impacted on registration numbers with a marginal 0.4% net growth for the year and new sponsor partnership and commercial opportunities were hard to secure due to the uncertain economic climate. This coupled with Football West undertaking the financial and administrative support of the Perth Glory Women's Westfield W-League team and the departure of the Chief Executive Officer in June 2009 combined to provide challenging times for the organisation.

Despite the challenges, Football West has consolidated a number of areas of the business and is well placed to experience growth into the 2010 season and maximise the opportunities which will arise thanks to the growing profile of the sport.

Competitions

In 2009, participation numbers for the metro competitions were 23,089 (1% increase) and for the regional competitions were 10,304 (2% decrease) with a total registration figure of 33,393.

2009 saw the introduction of the Flexible Signage Solutions Finals Series for the State Premier Division which was a tremendous success with a bumper crowd enjoying the Grand Final at Clipsal Stadium. The finals series format is set to continue in 2010 and beyond.

The State League Review is nearing finalisation with consultation now concluded. It is currently being collated for submission to the Football West Board to consider the recommendations and make its final determination for implementation in 2012.

The continuation of the management of the Perth Glory Women's team in the Westfield W-League provided another element to Football West's responsibilities outside of the traditional winter season. The Westfield W-League provides a critical part in the pathway for our talented female players and will also spark further interest in the women's game. Football West is delighted that ABC TV continues their support of the women's game via live match broadcasts in each round.

2009 saw the conclusion of the FFA's National Futsal Review, the findings of which will feed the structure for planning of a Football West Futsal Competition in the future.

The lack of facilities remains a concern for our growing sport, both in terms of quality and quantity. The independent study into football facilities commissioned by the Department of Sport and Recreation concluded in 2009, and will now feed into the National Facilities Audit being conducted by FFA.

Rules of Competition and related Rules and Regulations were re-written for the 2009 season and will be further reviewed and enhanced moving into 2010 and beyond.

Small Sided Football was implemented in the 6-9s age groups with generally positive feedback received by participants and organisers. The roll out of SSF will continue in the coming seasons, with 10 year olds enjoying the experience from next season and 11 year olds being the last age group to join in 2011.

The launch of MyFootballClub saw the implementation of online registrations in 2009 and this is set to continue with improvements being rolled out in 2010. The project is aimed at simplifying the registrations process and the workload on our volunteer group.

Refereeing

2009 saw Football West embark on a referee recruitment campaign at the beginning of the season, which led to participation numbers increasing by 20% to 380 registered referees in the metropolitan area. This allowed for a continual increase in the coverage rate at all levels, but in order to achieve this it was necessary for the expansion of the Football West Referees Department.

The addition of a part-time Operations Support Officer provided additional resources to assist with referee allocations and other administrative duties relating to the increased numbers. Although issues with the junior allocation processes still remain, it is anticipated that these will be stabilised for the 2010 season with the additional modules in the development and training of our software program.

The Respect program was launched at the beginning of the 2009 season with a great response from players, clubs, supporters and referees alike. An increase in club education was a priority for this year, and in conjunction with the Respect program, the Referees Department continued to conduct club referee courses, with zones also encouraged to hold information nights for their members.

The introduction of a basic schools referee course saw another avenue of educating the wider football community, with a number of schools taking up this option throughout the year. All recognised regional referee associations were visited by the Referees Department in the first half of 2009 in order to personally deliver information regarding law changes, directives and practical referee training. Due to our increased service to the regional areas, it is likely that two additional regional referee groups (Inner Pilbara and Lower South West) will be established during 2010.

Marketing & Communications

2009 saw the launch of two brand new Football West websites, with the primary website at www.footballwest.com.au and a secondary multimedia specific site at www.footballwest.tv. Both websites have put Football West at the forefront for online technology and innovation and are proving extremely popular with users not just in Western Australia, but throughout Australia and internationally. The primary website features a vastly improved club finder module as well as capability for online registrations and payments for many Football West programs, a resource which saves time for the stakeholders and also administration staff. The TV website features video and photo of State League matches and events throughout the year and provides excellent interactivity between the game and stakeholders and is proving popular amongst the local football community.

Sponsorship was down on 2008, due mainly to the Global Financial Crisis and uncertainty amongst existing Football West sponsors in the marketplace. Football West will be well positioned to boost its sponsorship income in future years to coincide with the FIFA World CupTM after a review and consolidation of its sponsorship and commercial properties.

The 2009 season saw live match broadcasts on 107.3 Heritage FM for the State League Premier Division. A one hour preview show on Friday nights was also a new feature, with divisions from all levels of the local game featured.

The local game continues to receive strong coverage from Community News outlets including online; however there is a strong shift from commercial TV stations and major newspapers away from community level sport and on to national and international level competitions.

Successful events and awards held throughout the season included the State League season launch, Gold Medal Dinner, ASM Awards, Women's Awards and various State team presentation nights.

Education & Development

Junior programs in the metropolitan area included Harvey Fresh Footworx School Holiday program, Futsal Development and Street Fourz Tournaments. High Performance programs are now established as a clear pathway to State representation.

Football West was represented at the National Youth Championships in the following age groups: Girls 14s, 15s and 17s and Boys 13s, 14s and 15s and Futsal 12s, 14s, 16s and women.

The girls National Training Centre Program was accepted into the Western Australian Institute of Sport, while Football West continue to administer the boys National Training Centre Program with the support of DSR and FFA. Over 20 participants from both programs have either represented Australia at international level or at national training camps.

Football West continues to increase school visits and encouraging students from Years 1 to 7 to participate in skill sessions including the Perth Glory Cup Championships for boys and girls in conjunction with School Sport WA. The Secondary School program continues to expand.

Regionally, coaching support is provided to academies in Albany, Kalgoorlie, Geraldton, Country Coastal and Leeuwin Naturaliste. The South West Academy of Sport is providing an added tier to elite players in the south west region and the benefits of this program will soon be witnessed.

Inclusive programs such as Indigenous, Disability and CaLD (Culturally and Linguistic Diverse) are gaining momentum with partnerships being developed with specific government bodies including the WA Police Department - and the Football with the Fuzz program.

Coach education, both in the metropolitan area and regionally continue to be held on a regular basis. An increase in female accreditation was shown in the past year.

Our focus for 2010 is to implement the FFA National Curriculum and Community Coach Education programs. We look forward to welcoming the FFA Skills Acquisition Trainer who will commence the program in July 2010 working alongside the Football West Development Team.

Summary

2010 is shaping up to be another exciting year for football in WA, with the FIFA World CupTM in South Africa putting the game back in the spotlight and further increasing the profile of our sport. The Board of Directors and senior management will continue the progress on the proposed home of football, which will provide a first class facility for the entire football community to utilise and further strengthen the sport and it's standing.

I would like to thank the Board of Directors and Football West staff for their effort, hard work and dedication over the 2009 season. Thanks also to our valued sponsor and commercial partners in the game as well as funding sources from the state and federal governments. I would also like to recognise the efforts of the standing committees, zone representatives, clubs, officials, volunteers, players and supporters of the world game throughout the previous 12 months and look forward to reaching new heights in 2010.

Football West Limited is a member of Football Federation Australia and administers Football through the state of Western Australia. Football West promotes, provides and regulates football in Western Australia via managed competitions and development programs.

Football West Ltd is a not-for-profit company and any profits, other income and property must be applied to promote its principal activities.

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The results of the company for the year ended 30th September 2009 was loss of (\$75,096) (2008: (\$155,321)).

No dividends have been paid by the company or recommended by the directors since the commencement of this financial year. Under the Football West Limited constitution no dividends can be transferred to members.

REVIEW OF OPERATIONS

Season 2009 saw Football West stabilise its position as the sport's government body in Western Australia. Participation grew marginally to over 33,000 registered players which include both metropolitan and regional competitions.

The primary areas of focus in 2009 were;

- The review of management and administration protocols to competition.
- The review of potential competitions for 2011.
- The implementation of a service orientated culture
- The review and implementation of the FFA National (Technical) Curriculum for the elite player pathways.
- The review of Referees allocations for 2010.

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN THE STATE OF AFFAIRS

The Directors are not aware of any significant changes in the state of affairs during the year ended 30 September 2009.

1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Basis of Accounting

The financial report is a special purpose financial report which has been prepared specifically for distribution to members in accordance with the entity's constitution. The directors have determined that that the Company is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the *Corporations Act* 2001, and the recognition and measurement requirements of the following applicable Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards:

AASB 101	Presentation of Financial Statements
AASB 107	Cash Flow Statements
AASB 108	Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors
AASB 110	Events after the Balance Sheet Date

No other Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report is prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report:

(b) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(c) Trade and other receivables

Trade receivables are recognised and carried at original invoice amount less a provision for any uncollectible amounts. An estimate for doubtful debts is made when collection of the full amount is no longer probable. Bad debts are written off as incurred.

Receivables from related parties are recognised and carried at the nominal amount due.

(d) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(e) Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, leasehold buildings, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on a diminishing value basis on all plant and equipment, at rates calculated to allocate the cost, less estimated residual value, against revenue over the estimated useful lives of the assets.

1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

The depreciation period used for each class of depreciable assets is:

Major depreciation periods are: 2009

Plant and Equipment 3 to 5 years (20% or 30%)

Leasehold Buildings 20 years (5%)

(f) Leases

Leases of fixed assets where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership that are transferred to entities in the economic entity are classified as finance leases.

Leased incentives under operating leases are recognised as a liability and amortised on a straight-line basis over the life of the lease term.

(g) Trade and Other Creditors

Liabilities for trade creditors and other amounts are carried at cost which is the fair value of the consideration to be paid in the future for goods and services rendered, whether or not billed, to the entity.

Payables to related parties are carried at their principal amount.

(h) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the company's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on-costs. Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits.

(i) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the company has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

(j) Revenue Recognition

Revenue from the sale of goods and services is recognised upon the delivery of the good or service except for revenue generated from referees.

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

Player registration and team entry fees are recognised at the time of registration.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(k) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the assets or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the balance sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

(I) Grants and Sponsorship Income

Grant and Sponsorship income is recognised in income when received from the granting authority. In order for the grant to be recognised in income, the following conditions must be satisfied:

- the entity must control the contribution or the right to receive the contribution.
- it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the entity.
- the amount can be reliably measured.

If it is more than probable the contribution will be returned to the contributing authority then the grant contribution will be recognised as a liability.

(m) Comparative Figures

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year.

(n) Borrowings

Borrowings are initially recognised at fair value, net of transaction costs incurred. Borrowings are subsequently measured at amortised cost. Any difference between the proceeds (net of transaction costs) and the redemption amount is recognised in the income statement over the period of the borrowings using the effective interest method.

Borrowings are removed from the balance sheet when the obligation specified in the contract is discharged, cancelled or expired. The difference between the carrying amount of a financial liability that has been extinguished or transferred to another party and the consideration is paid, including any non-cash assets transferred or liabilities assumed, is recognised in other income or other expenses.

Borrowings are classified as current liabilities unless the Group has an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting date.

(o) Income Tax

Football West is exempt from income tax by virtue of Section 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 (Cth).
