FOOTBALL AUSTRALIA VOLUNTEER POLICIES

FA appointed match volunteers are expected to comply with the following instructions:

1. Attend all non-match day and match day briefing sessions and meetings arranged by the Football Australia.
2. Arrive at the match venue at the time stipulated by the Football Australia.
3. Must wear uniform provided / specified by the Football Australia.
4. Abide by accreditation terms including not issuing / lending passes to friends / family / general public.
5. Adhering to radio protocol if issued with a radio.
6. Must not loiter in the player's tunnel, outside team dressing rooms and areas not directly related to their role.
7. Must not stand in the tunnel during the match.
8. Must sit down in seats allocated by the FA when not working.
9. Must not eat in the tunnel or whilst working on the field of play. Field of Play Assistants are permitted to place a bottle of water/drink underneath their chair.
10. Agree not to use mobile telephones, photographic cameras, video cameras and any other electronic devices upon entering the match venue.
11. Agree not to request an autograph from any player, team official, club official or any other individual.
12. If requested to, return accreditation at the end of the match.
13. Always abide by Football Australia management and staff directions.
